## IVS and the REMOTE EDUCATION ACT

Public Act 96-0684 (HB 2448, 8/25/09) and modified PA 97-0339 (HB 3223, 8/12/11): Authorizes school districts to create and offer "remote educational programs" tailored to individual student needs and claim GSA for those programs (105 ILCS 10-29 School Code). Guidelines for the REA are being written by the ISBE.

**Definition of Remote Education Program (REP):** "(a) An educational program delivered to students in the home or other location outside of a school building." These programs will be subject to requirements and parameters as set forth in the Act.
